Lab Coat	Students are required to wear and maintain a clean, professional lab coat and chef hat for laboratory classes.		\$45
iClicker Remote	Students are required to purchase a iClicker Remote for required courses. The iClicker remote system is used for classroom interaction and student engagement.		\$50
