

Pathway to becoming a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist at the University of Illinois

Track 1: Freshmen Entry

Start as a
<u>Dietetics &</u>
<u>Nutrition Major</u>

Complete DPD
courses, and apply for
the <u>MS in CCN</u>
<u>Program</u>*. This requires
a minimum of a 3.0
GPA

Begin graduate coursework during years 3-4 of undergrad and apply to the <u>Dietetic Internship</u> (DI)*

Finish up MS and complete the DI

Track 2: Undergraduates transferring into the program

Previous coursework
will be reviewed to
see which <u>Gen-</u>
<u>Ed/DPD</u> requirements
can be waived

Complete DPD and apply to the MS in CCN Program. Begin MS in undergrad if schedule allows*

Finish up MS courses and <u>apply</u> to the DI.

Complete the DI

Eligibility to take the <u>CDR Exam</u> and become an RDN

Track 3: Graduate Entry

Apply for the <u>MS in</u>
<u>CCN Program</u>. This
requires a minimum of
a 3.0 GPA

Complete DPD and most MS requirements, and apply to the DI

Complete the DI, with some flexibility to finish MS degree

Track 4: Post-Baccalaureate Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD) Certificate

For students who have already done a Master's but still need a <u>DPD Certificate</u> Complete DPD
requirements on-campus
(program length varies
depending on prior
coursework completed),
and apply to the DI

Pathway to becoming a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist at the University of Illinois

Track 1: Freshmen already admitted to the program

- The University of Illinois offers a pathway for students to complete the Bachelor's, Master's, and Dietetic Internship.
- Student completes the Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD) and begins Master of Science in Clinical & Community Nutrition courses in junior + senior year.
- Student can transfer up to 12 credit hours of 400-500 level courses that do not already count for the BS degree toward MS degree requirements.
- Student finishes remaining MS courses and completes Dietetic Internship (DI).

Track 2: Undergraduates transferring into the program

- Student's prior coursework will be reviewed to determine which classes fulfill General Education/DPD requirements.
- Student enrolls in the DPD and begins MS courses as able.
- Timeline varies depending on the number of courses remaining.

Track 3: Graduate students who need the DPD (and have a different BS degree)

- Student will take DPD + MS courses simultaneously.
- Complete the DI after 80% of degree requirements have been met.
- Some online MS classes may be taken during the DI.
- Proficiency exams available for FSHN 101, 150 and 220.
- 400-level DPD courses can count toward MS degree requirements.

Track 4: Students who need the DPD but already have their Master's degree

- The University of Illinois offers an on-campus Post-Baccalaureate Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD) Certificate.
- For students who have completed their Master's and wish to complete their DPD requirements to obtain their DPD Verification Statement.
- The DPD verification statement is required for entry into the Dietetic Internship.



Program Credit Hour Requirements

Bachelor's Degree in Dietetics & Nutrition: 126 credit hours

Master's Degree in Clinical & Community Nutrition: 32 credit hours

FSHN 590 (5 hours) and 591 (5 hours) can count towards the 32 hour requirement
