Mission: The University of Illinois Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD) will provide high-quality, innovative food, and nutrition education along with the necessary communication skills to prepare students for supervised practice, leading to eligibility for the Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR) credentialing exam, which will enable them to become registered dietitian nutritionists, and become leaders in the field promoting healthy food and nutrition practices across the United States and globally.





96% of program graduates that applied to a Supervised Practice Program are admitted within 12 months of graduation.



99% of program graduates pass the RDN Exam (the national CDR credentialing exam) within one year of the first attempt.



98% of program graduates rate the Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD) as meeting their needs for Supervised Practice or Graduate School.



86% of program graduates have obtained or are in the process of obtaining a graduate degree or board-certified specialist credential.

The Department of Food Science & Human Nutrition also offers a Master of Science in Clinical & Community Nutrition and Graduate Dietetic Internship. Qualifying students may be able to complete our BS/MS/DI program.
